NOTE TO CORRESPONDENTS

(The following was received from the UN Information Center in Moscow.)

A dinner in honor of Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjold, now visiting Moscow, was given last night (25 March) by the Soviet Government.

Among those present were Nikita S. Khrushchëv, First Secretary of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union and Member of the Presidium of the Supreme Soviet of the USSR; Anastas I. Mikoyan, Deputy Prime Minister; Andrei A. Gromyko, Foreign Minister; Alexei I. Kirichenko, Secretary and Member of the Presidium of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union; Frol R. Kozlov, Chairman of the Council of Ministers of the Russian Socialist Federated Soviet Republic and Member of the Presidium of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union; Luka F. Palamarchuk, Foreign Minister of the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic; Kuzma V. Kiselev, Foreign Minister of the Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic; and Rolf Sohlman, Swedish Ambassador in Moscow.
