Extracts from the Rules and Regulations of the Club

Honorary Members shall have all the privileges of Members without payment of Entrance Fee or Subscription, except that they shall have no voice in the management of the Club. (Rule V.)

The Club-house is open at 8.30 a.m. daily.

No Member shall give a gratuity to any servant of the Club.

Every Member shall pay his bill before he leaves the house for all expenses incurred in the Club.

Strangers who may call upon a Member are admitted into the Club-house if the Member is in the Club.

Strangers, if introduced and accompanied by a Member, may be admitted between the hours of ten o'clock a.m. and twelve o'clock noon to view the house.

Members may invite not more than three guests to any meal on any day.

Club bedrooms are available for use by Members.

A copy of the Rules and Regulations of the Club can be obtained from the Secretary.

Extract from the Rules and Regulations of the Club

Temporary Members shall have all the privileges of Members without payment of Entrance Fee or Subscription except that they shall have no vote in the management of the Club (Rule V.)

The Entrance Fee is £5.00 per annum.

No Member shall have a right to any portion of the Club.

Every Member shall pay the full balance he owes the Club for all expenses incurred by him.

Strangers who may wish to be admitted into the Club should apply to the Secretary.

Strangers if introduced and accompanied by a Member may be admitted between the hours of ten o'clock a.m. and twelve o'clock p.m. to view the Club.

Members pay for the use of the Club more than they are entitled to any part of the Club.

Club buildings are available for use by Members.
