Sec. Gen. — to Pandit. J. Nehru (Prime Minister

31 March 1959

On my return to Headquarters I hasten to send you my warm personal thanks for all the generous hospitality shown by your Government to me during our stay in India. You made the visit a most memorable and useful one.

Especially, however, I wish to thank you personally for your hospitality and for the long talk I had with you following the pleasant luncheon on the day of my arrival. I highly appreciated the friendly and open spirit in which you discussed various matters. A contact like this one is for me of the highest value in my work, but just as much appreciated on a human basis.

Short of your forthcoming arrangements for the flights in India and Afghanistan, my visit to Kabul would not have been possible.

The visit to Moscow and Sochi, with a long and personal talk with Mr. Khrushchev, was most interesting and confirmed the evaluation which we seemed to share when we touched upon the German question in Delhi. I noted especially Mr. Khrushchev's strong emphasis on negotiations and his flexibility as to the time and the situation in which the USSR would consider it necessary to proceed with a unilateral agreement with East Germany.
