My dear Ambassador,

... I am most grateful for your letter of 7 November 1960, concerning candidates for the post of my Special Representative in Somalia. As you know, this is a matter of great interest to me, and I enclose, for your information, a copy of a letter which I have to-day addressed to the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Pakistan, requesting him to make Mr. S.K. Dehlavi available for the appointment.

The ties between Pakistan and Somalia will make it possible for Mr. Dehlavi to readily build up the relationship of understanding and mutual trust with the Government of Somalia on which the real success of his mission will depend. I have every confidence that his services will be of the greatest assistance to the new Republic, and that the experience he gains will, for its part, be of benefit to the Government of Pakistan in its future relations with the newly independent States of Africa.
