- NEW YORK, N.Y., 19 March 1957 -

Secretary-General Dag HAMMARSKJOLD left New York this afternoon for "exploratory talks" in Cairo. He is scheduled to reach Egypt Thursday afternoon, 21 March. In reply to questions, he said he expected to be away for ten days or a fortnight, adding that it was possible he might also visit Jerusalem.

U.N. SALVAGE FLEET REMOVES TUG "EDGAR BONNET"

- ISMAILIA, Egypt, 25 March 1957 -

Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjold, Gen. Raymond Wheeler and other U.N. officials watched today as ships of the U.N. salvage fleet began lifting the "Edgar Bonnet", a 1,390-ton tug which had blocked the Suez Canal near Ismailia, some 46 miles south of Port Said. Gen. Wheeler, who is in charge of clearing the Suez Canal, expects to have the vessel completely afloat today and to tow her tomorrow to workshops at Lake Timsah. HAMMARSKJOLD REVIEWS UNEF UNITS

UN 53752 - ABU SUWEIR, Egypt, 25 March 1957 -

After watching the raising of the tug 'Edgar Bonnet' and visiting with Gen. Wheeler, who is in charge of the clearing of the Suez Canal, at his Headquarters in Ismailia, Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjold at noon today reviewed units of the U.N. Emergency Force (UNEF) at Abu Suweir. In a half-hour tour of the camp he visited UNEF workshops, a stores depot, the Canadian base hospital, an ordnance unit and the communications base. Maj.-Gen. E.L.M. Burns, Commander of UNEF, conducted Mr. Hammarskjold and Under-Secretary Ralph Bunche on the tour and introduced officers in charge of operation to them. Mr. BUNCHE, Gen. WHEELER, Mr. HAMMARSKJOLD and Gen. BURNS are seen here (l. to r.) in front of the Otter aircraft in which they came to Abu Suweir.
