MEMORANDUM

Mr. Tekoah visited me today at his request, and, in the course of our talk, said that he wished to inform me of a matter that he was instructed to bring to our attention but that he preferred not to bother the Secretary-General with yesterday.

He said the matter in question concerns the new generator on Mount Scopus which has been installed and is operating. The Israeli authorities have now received word from UNTSO (on the 5th of February) that beginning with the convoy on the 18th of February no more butagas is to be allowed in the convoys. General Van Horn is said to have informed Biran that UNTSO views this prohibition as a "matter of principle", on the basis of the Urrutia Agreement (i.e., the new generator arrangement being conditional on stopping the butagas supply). The Israeli authorities understand that there has been no Jordanian protest.

General Van Horn is said to have informed the Israelis that the UNTSO ruling is firm but that the question could be taken up with UN Headquarters.

Tekoah says that the message indicates that the Israelis, being confronted with this ruling on the basis of principle, are themselves taking a strong opposite position also as a matter of principle.

Tekoah swears that the subject of butagas was never mentioned in the Urrutia discussions. He does recall, however, that in the meeting I had in Eytan's office last spring, at which Tekoah was present, I read a cable from Urrutia in which he said that butagas was not to be

allowed in the convoys after the new generator would be installed. Tekoah reiterated that butagas had not been discussed with Urrutia. He indicated, however, that the Israelis would be prepared to a limitation on the amount of butagas allowed as was done in the case of the benzine.
