STATEMENT BY A UNITED NATIONS SPOKESMAN

As stated by the Secretary-General in his last two press conferences, he is considering the possibility of visiting some member countries before going to Geneva for the meeting of the Economic and Social Council early in July. He has had in mind specifically the possibility of visiting some of the countries in the Middle East in line with the regular visits he has paid to that region for the past few years. As the plans are not yet completed, no detailed information can be given. Were he to go to the region, he would as usual cover pending questions. If difficulties which have arisen regarding the Danish freighter Inge Toft were not to be resolved before the time of a visit to Cairo, the problem would in these circumstances naturally be one of those that would be discussed as part of the continuing efforts of the Secretary-General to assist in straightening out difficulties arising among the countries in the Middle East. When the Secretary-General, within the limits of his functions in relation to the Middle Eastern problems, raises a question of this type it is always on his own initiative as an independent representative of the United Nations and never as a spokesman for the specific interest of any one country in relation to others.

UN SECRETARY-GENERAL ARRIVES IN CAIRO

(The following was received here from the UN Information Center in Cairo.)

Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjold and his party arrived late yesterday (30 June) in Cairo, where they were met at the airport by Ambassador Abdel-Hamid Naffi Zada, Chief of Protocol in the Foreign Ministry of the United Arab Republic; by Brigadier General Salah Gohar, Director of Palestine Affairs; by Brigadier General Amin Hilmy, Chief Liaison Officer of the United Arab Republic with the United Nations Emergency Force, and by the staff of the United Nations Information Center in Cairo.

The Secretary-General's plane arrived at 10:35 p.m., local time.

The Secretary-General had supper with Lieutenant General E.L.M. Burns, Commander of UNEF, upon his arrival at his hotel.

This morning, at 10 a.m., the Secretary-General is meeting with Foreign Minister Mahmoud Fawzi. Tonight he is to dine with President Gamal Abdel Nasser.

SECRETARY-GENERAL HOLDS FOUR-HOUR MEETING
WITH FOREIGN MINISTER OF UNITED ARAB REPUBLIC

Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjold met today for four hours with Foreign Minister Mahmoud Fawzi, Foreign Minister of the United Arab Republic. At 6 p.m. tonight (local time) he will meet and dine with President Gamal Abdel Nasser (see Press Release SG/827).

On Thursday, Mr. Hammarskjold has scheduled a meeting at 10 a.m. with Dr. Fawzi. Later, a luncheon in honor of the Secretary-General will be given by the Foreign Minister at the Mohammed Aly Club.

SECRETARY-GENERAL MEETS AGAIN WITH FOREIGN MINISTER OF UNITED ARAB REPUBLIC

(The following was received here from the UN Information Center, Cairo.)

United Nations Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjold met again this morning with Mahmoud Fawzi, Foreign Minister of the United Arab Republic. The meeting lasted for two and one-half hours.

At 4 o'clock this afternoon (local time) Mr. Hammarskjold scheduled a meeting with Ambassador Abdel Khalek Hassouna, Secretary-General of the Arab League; at 5:30 p.m. with Ahmed el-Shukeiri, Minister of State for United Nations Affairs of Saudi Arabia; and at 7 p.m. he was to meet again with Dr. Fawzi.

Guests at luncheon today with the Secretary-General included Farid Zein el-Din, Deputy Foreign Minister of the United Arab Republic; Mr. Hassouna; Lieut. General E.L.M. Burns, Commander of the UN Emergency Force; Ambassadors of Arab countries in Cairo; the two Vice-Presidents of the National Bank of Egypt; other high government officials and representatives of the UN and the specialized agencies in Cairo.

Mr. Hammarskjold is planning to leave Cairo as scheduled at 8 a.m. (local time) Friday, 3 July.

EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT TO SECRETARY-GENERAL
LEAVES FOR GENEVA FOR CONSULTATIONS

At the request of the Secretary-General, Andrew W. Cordier, Executive Assistant to the Secretary-General, departs for Geneva today for consultations. His visit coincides with the presence in Geneva of Major General Carl Carlsson von Horn, Chief of Staff of the United Nations Truce Supervision Organization in Palestine, and of Adrian Pelt,* Special Representative of the Secretary-General in Guinea, with whom consultations will take place.

Mr. Cordier has responsibility for follow-up administrative work in these two areas. He expects to be in Geneva for several days.
