

Dear Dag:

This acknowledges your "personal and confidential" envelope containing a carbon copy of your message to the Swedish Ambassador in Peking dated February 2, 1955, transmitted to me "for personal and confidential information."

I really have no "personal" existence in an affair of this kind. As I told you yesterday, the United States objects to the second paragraph of your "primo" and the United States also objects to the whole of your "secundo" which we think exceeds your authority.
