Dear Mr Chen Chao-Yuan,

First I wish to thank you very much for the splendid lunch in your home. It was a most interesting and agreeable experience to taste real Chinese food. I hope to have an early opportunity of returning your hospitality.

I thank you also for your interest in the exhibition of Chinese books that we are planning. Our exhibition room will be free during the month of December and January; I think January would be preferable. To supplement our own material of old Chinese manuscripts and rare books I think we should need about 200 modern Chinese books. The catalogues I gave you will give you an idea of how we usually arrange exhibits of foreign books.
