U.N. Secretary-General Dag HAMMARSKJÖLD and a staff of five left New York this afternoon on their mission to Peiping. They will fly via London, Paris and New Delhi. The journey is undertaken in fulfillment of Mr. Hammarskjöld's mandate by the General Assembly to seek the release of all detained U.N. Command personnel who wish to be repatriated, including 11 U.S. airmen sentenced to imprisonment on espionage charges by the Chinese People's Republic. Mr. Hammarskjöld was escorted to the airport by a number of U.N. officials and representatives to the United Nations. Pledging himself to "do my best" to discharge the task entrusted to him by the General Assembly, U.N. Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjöld left New York by air this afternoon for London, on the first stage of his mission to Peking. As requested by the Assembly, Mr. Hammarskjöld will attempt to secure the release of all U.N. Command personnel detained against their will by the Chinese People's Republic, including eleven United States airmen sentenced to prison terms on espionage charges. Mr. Hammarskjöld was escorted to the airport by a number of U.N. officials and representatives to the United Nations.
