Dear Mr. Kuznetsov,

I draw your attention to the General Assembly resolutions on the Hungarian question, 21 November 1956, which I had the honour to transmit to your Government immediately after their adoption.

You will remember that the General Assembly requested me to report without delay on the compliance with these resolutions. It would be my intention to present such a report tomorrow, one week after the adoption of the resolutions. I would therefore appreciate it if you would give me any information which, in your view, I should take into account in my report, to the extent <sup>that</sup> it has to cover points in the resolutions, referring to the USSR.

I wish to inform you that I have addressed a request to the Hungarian Government for an immediate clarification of the position of the Government to the requests made by the General Assembly.

Sir,

In acknowledging receipt of your letter dated 28 November 1956 relating to the General Assembly resolution of 21 November on the so-called question of "The situation in Hungary", I have the honour to make the following statement.

The position of the Government of the USSR on the above question was explained in the note of 13 November 1956 addressed to you by the Permanent Mission of the USSR.

So far as concerns General Assembly resolution A/RES/407 of 21 November 1956, I must draw your attention to the statement on the subject made by Mr. Shepilov, the Chairman of the USSR delegation, at the plenary meeting of the General Assembly held on 19 November, and to the Hungarian Government's statement of 18 November. As was declared in these statements, allegations of the deportation of Hungarian citizens to the USSR are based on slanderous rumours circulated by certain groups for the purpose of misleading public opinion.
