Otis, AP:

Vienna: The Soviet Controlled Hungarian Government announced tonight that it will be impossible for Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjöld to visit Budapest on 16 December as he had hoped.

The Government said Hammarskjöld might think he was coming to inspect the situation in Hungary on 16 December, but that he was mistaken, because the time was "not suitable" to the Hungarian Government. Therefore, the visit will not take place on 16 December. No alternative date was mentioned at all.
