I am pleased to refer to our recent possible appointment of two Netherlands observers for Hungary. Since then I have been informed by the Netherlands Government that two persons whose qualifications can be considered to meet fully the requirements for the function under reference, have declared their readiness to accept an appointment as U.N. observers.

They are:

1. Dr. A.M. Joekes, Member of the Council of State since 1952. Dr. Joekes has been a member of the Second Chamber of the States General from 1925 to 1948. In 1948 he became Minister for Social Affairs and Public Health which post he held until 1952.

In 1946, 1947 and 1949 Dr. Joekes was Chairman of the Netherlands Delegation to the International Labour Conference at Geneva; in 1946 he was Vice-President of the Conference.

Dr. Joekes is chairman of the Association for an International Legal Order, which is a member of the World Federation of United Nations Associations.

I have the honour to refer to our recent conversation concerning the possible appointment of Netherlands nationals as United Nations observers for Hungary. Since then I have been informed by the Netherlands Government that two persons whose qualifications can be considered to meet fully the requirements for the function under reference, have declared their readiness to accept an appointment as U.N. observers.

They are:

1. Dr. A.M. Joekes, Member of the Council of State since 1952. Dr. Joeke

s was Chairman of the Netherlands Delegation to the International Labour Conference at Geneva; in 1946 he was Vice President of the Conference. Dr. Joeke



2. Dr. C.L. Patijn, Member of the Second Chamber of the States General. Dr. Patijn was a member of the Netherlands Delegations to the regular sessions of the General Assembly from 1948 to 1955. During 1956 Dr. Patijn is chairman of the Executive Committee of U.N.R.E.F. In 1948 and 1954 Dr. Patijn was Netherlands Delegate to the International Conferences of the World Council of Churches.
