Had planned Monday to send you qualifications of Coates UK national now executive officer for Department Economic and Social Affairs. Coates had excellent mission record in Korea and Balkans plus first class record as long time member Indian Civil service, where he presided administratively over Punjab area comprising several million people. This involved close contact with population including care of large refugee groups.

Assume however you are quite prepared to take Reddaway and therefore will not elaborate on Coates qualifications. Hope for Secretary Generals reply tomorrow.

Reur Beico 42 I do not consider that Twigt's status precludes his being nominated arbitrator. He himself might object should he feel that he is put in an embarrassing position. Twigt is now with UNEF in Gaza. Regarding other suitable arbitrators I would suggest first instance Professor Nihat Erim of Turkey and Mustafa Kamil Yasseen of Iraq, both members of International Law Commission; also Dr. Hamed Sultan of Cairo, former Legal Adviser Foreign Office, who has experience in arbitration. I wonder, however, if experts in commercial law might not be preferable. In order to make further suggestions, would appreciate more information on dispute. Could also suggest, if desired, names of high calibre Greek lawyers.
