Travel or trip files: these files contain mainly the arrangements and schedules for a trip, but in many cases, especially the longer trips, they contain also press releases, correspondence received and dealt with away from Headquarters and communications with Headquarters. Seperate closed envelopes in these trip files contain code cables (however, not all codes are thus separated within the trip files. These files cover the whole period 1953/61. In case a certain period of DH's Secretary-Generalship should be studied, the trip files during that specific period should be consulted also.
