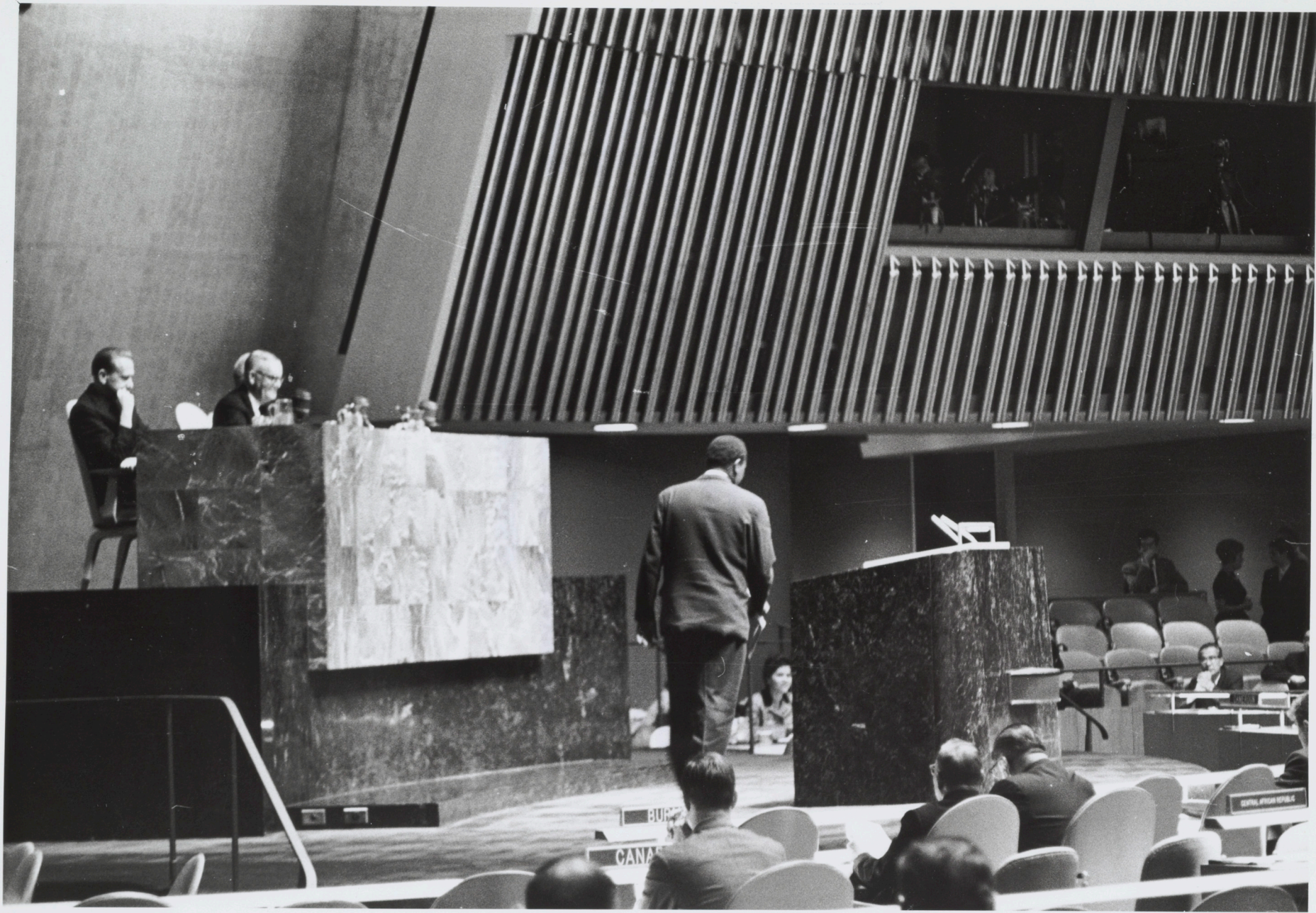

The draft resolution of Ghana, India, Indonesia, the United Arab Republic and Yugoslavia, under which the United Nations General Assembly would have expressed hope for renewal of recently interrupted contacts between "the President of the United States of America and the Chairman of the Council of Ministers of the USSR", was withdrawn by its sponsors early this morning.

Here is a view of the Assembly Hall during the meeting. Withdrawal of the resolution followed the deletion of the mention of the President of the United States and the Chairman of the Council of Ministers of the USSR from the operative paragraph of the draft.
