Riley today gave an address to members of the United Nations staff at Headquarters regarding his experiences in connection with the supervision of the truce and implementation of the four armistice agreements between Egypt, the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, Lebanon and Syria on the one hand, and Israel on the other. General Riley served as U.N. Chief of Staff in charge of the U.N. Truce Supervision Organization in Palestine from October 1948 to June of this year.

The United Nations Economic and Social Council, in plenary session in Geneva, today discussed the question of access to U.N. Headquarters of representatives of non-governmental organizations in consultative status, a question which has been the subject of negotiations between the United States and the United Nations.

This photograph gives a partial view of the meeting as U.N. Secretary-General Dag HAMMARSKJOLD (sixth from right, at conference table) reported to the Council on his talks with U.S. representatives. He stated that while the subject was covered by the Headquarters Agreement, in exceptional cases, he was confident an understanding had been reached which would enable the Secretary-General to "safeguard the interests of the U.N. while recognizing the legitimate interests of the U.S.," in regard to its own security.
