The President of Turkey, Mr. Celâl BAYAR, who is at present engaged in a goodwill tour of the United States, today paid an official visit to United Nations Headquarters, in New York. Mr. Dag Hammarskjöld, Secretary-General of the United Nations, greeted the President on his arrival here, and escorted him on a tour of part of the buildings.

Using the opportunity afforded by the visit of the Director-General elect of the Food and Agriculture Organization, Dr. Philip V. CARDON, to U.N. Headquarters, U.N. Secretary-General Dag HAMMARSKJÖLD (left) this morning showed Dr. CARDON (right) the new FAO commemorative stamp which the United Nations Postal Administration will issue on 11 February.

In looking over the new stamps, both Dr. Cardon and the Secretary-General expressed the hope that their use might serve to call attention to the important work that the FAO is doing the world over.

* The stamp will be issued in 3-cent and 8-cent denominations; the former in green and gold, and the latter in blue and gold. The design depicts a head of wheat, symbol of FAO.

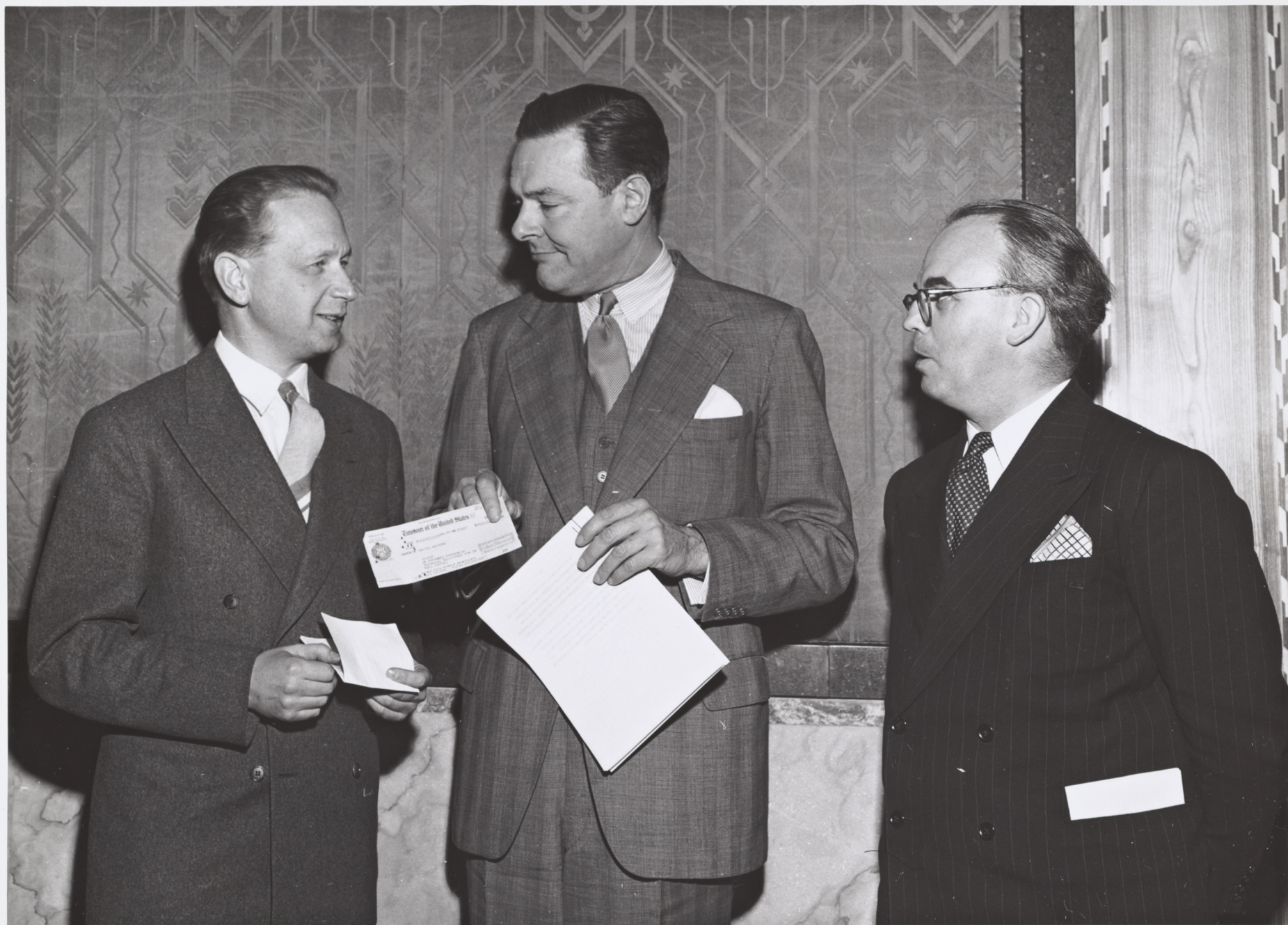
A check for \$3,904,000 changed hands at U.N. Headquarters this afternoon when Ambassador Henry Cabot LODGE, Jr. (left), Permanent Representative of the United States to the U.N., presented to Secretary-General Dag HARMARSKJÖLD (center) the first installment of the U.S. Government contribution for 1954 to the United Nations' Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance.

This photograph, taken in the Economic & Social Council chamber during the brief ceremony, shows the Secretary-General passing the check, in turn, on to David OWEN, Executive Chairman of the Technical Assistance Board (TAB), which coordinates the operations carried out by the various U.N. agencies participating in the program.
