Mr. Hammarskjöld, who left New York on 30 December, accompanied by a party of six, today stopped briefly in Karachi. Here is a picture of the press conference he held at the Airport building prior to his departure for New Delhi.

The Secretary-General expressed the hope that he would be able to visit Pakistan again, and said that he was "really proud" to have met Prime Minister Mohammad Ali (with whom he had had a forty-minute conversation. He described his stay as "just a stopover", and promised to return "in the near future."
