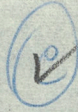

I wondered what I could do to help you, besides being concerned and telling you that I am. Immediately, I knew - I can pray for you.

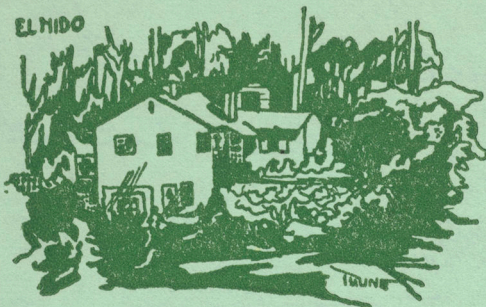
And, meaning it with all my heart
