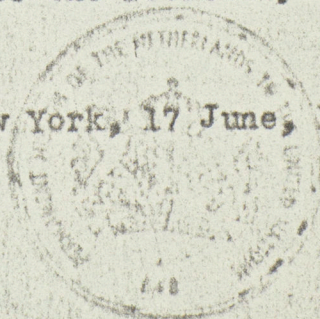

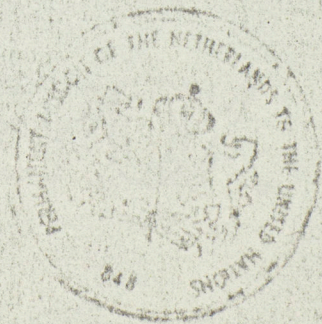

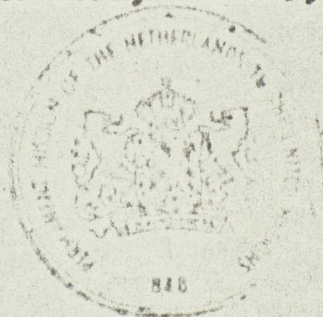

The Acting Permanent Representative of the Netherlands to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to inform Mr. Hammarskjöld that the Netherlands Government has decided to assign the following four officers for service with the United Nations Truce Supervision Organization in Palestine:

Major A. Heinen (Royal Netherlands Marines), born in 1925,

Captain G.C.J. Ballieux (Royal Netherlands Marines), born in 1921,

Captain J. Huivenaar (Royal Netherlands Airforce, groundtroops), born in 1923,

Captain W.L. Mallinckrodt (Royal Netherlands Airforce, groundtroops), born in 1925.

Captains Huivenaar and Mallinckrodt have both had complete infantry training. Further particulars will be transmitted at the earliest possible moment.

All four officers will be flown to Tel Aviv in the beginning of July 1958, by an aircraft of the Royal Netherlands Airforce.

These officers replace an equal number of the officers originally assigned for duty with U.N.T.S.O. as stated in the Permanent Representative's notes of May 6, 1958, No. 859, and of June 2, 1958, No. 1025, but who were subsequently placed at the disposal of the United Nations Observation Group in Lebanon.
