MEMORANDUM TO: Mr. Hammarskjöld

SUBJECT: Arrangements for Washington visit, Friday, 8 May 1953

The State Department has made the following arrangements:

1. Mr. Charles Cook of the U.S. Mission has been assigned to accompany you to facilitate your Washington arrangements.
2. At the Washington airport you will be met by Assistant Secretary of State John D. Hickerson and Mr. Paul Johansen, Director of the United Nations Information Center, Washington.
3. You will be taken to the office of Mr. Hickerson in the State Department building, where Ambassador Lodge will contact you for the visit to the White House.
4. The visit to the White House is scheduled for twelve o'clock. It is possible that the cabinet meeting will run over slightly but Ambassador Lodge's call will take that into account.
5. You will be taken to the White House by Secretary Dulles and Ambassador Lodge.
6. After the presidential appointment, you will be taken to the Blair-Lee house, the home for official entertainments, where Mr. Hickerson will give you a luncheon with a number of Assistant Secretaries and other high departmental officials who "will be related in one way or another to the Secretary-General's work." The State Department will send the list of these names to us this afternoon.
7. Taking the above schedule into account, we will arrange the air flight in accordance with your instructions.
