This is to confirm my cable of to-day:

"PLEASE DONT CANCEL RESERVATION GORING LETTER FOLLOWS".

As you have been informed by Mr. Trygve Lie's secretary, Mrs. Förde, Mr. Lie and his family are not coming to London for the Coronation, and will therefore not need the suite and the single room reserved for them in the Goring Hotel.

However, as we don't yet know if any arrangements have been made to accomodate the Secretary-General, Mr. Dag Hammarskjöld, who is attending the Coronation, we would be glad if you could keep the suite for him. The Secretary-General plans to arrive in London on Sunday, May 31st and to leave on Wednesday, June 3rd.


