SECRETARY-GENERAL'S VISIT IN GENEVA

Mr. Dag Hammarskjöld, the Secretary-General of the United Nations, landed this afternoon at Geneva airport, on the second leg of his European trip, after having spent several days at Stockholm.

Mr. Hammarskjöld will stay in Geneva until the afternoon of Friday, May 29. He will take a plane for Paris on that day.

The main purpose of Mr. Hammarskjöld's stay in Geneva is to preside at the session of the Administrative Committee on Co-ordination, which opens on Monday, May 25, and to visit the European Office of the United Nations. The Administrative Committee on Co-ordination will be attended by the Executive Heads of all the Specialized Agencies. The Secretary-General will also take the opportunity of establishing direct contacts with those agencies with headquarters at Geneva. On Friday, May 22, he will address the World Health Assembly; on Friday, 29 May, he will speak at the meeting of the ILO Governing Body. He may also participate in the meetings of some of the other UN organs now in session in Geneva.

At the Palais des Nations, Mr. Hammarskjöld will address the staff of the European Office in the Assembly Hall on Tuesday, May 26, at 9 a.m. As he did at Headquarters, he will visit the staff of the various units of United Nations in Geneva in their offices.

Mr. Hammarskjöld will also take the opportunity of visiting the Swiss authorities, both federal and cantonal.
