MEMORANDUM

8 March 1954

To : All Assistant Secretaries-General and Principal Directors
From : The Secretary-General
Subject : Entry to Headquarters District

Section 9(a) of the Headquarters Agreement specifies:

"The headquarters district shall be inviolable. Federal, state or local officers or officials of the United States, whether administrative, judicial, military or police, shall not enter the headquarters district to perform any official duties therein except with the consent of and under conditions agreed to by the Secretary-General. The service of legal process, including the seizure of private property, may take place within the headquarters district only with the consent of and under conditions approved by the Secretary-General."

On the basis of this provision I have now delegated to the Principal Director in charge of the Legal Department my right to decide for each situation whether approval should be given for entry to the Headquarters of any such governmental officers or officials. Accordingly, the necessary permission shall be sought from his office.

The Principal Director is also delegated to perform, or arrange for the performance of, the same function in other offices of the United Nations and in respect of similar authorities of other governments.
