Dear Mr. Guzik,

Your letter of 29th October 1954, in which you described a traffic and parking situation involving United Nations automobiles in the vicinity of the Empire State Building, has been referred to me.

I am quite certain that the automobiles you refer to are owned or operated by various member governments who have delegations with offices in the Empire State Building. The United Nations itself has no offices there, and the very few cars which we now operate cannot be contributing in any way to the congestion you mention.

Relationships between the member governments and local authorities are the concern of the United States Mission to the United Nations, and I am referring your letter to that Office for whatever action the officials there may deem appropriate.
