

Dear Mr. Secretary General:

You will recall that prior to the dispatch of the invitation issued by the Governments of France, the United Kingdom and the United States to the Soviet Government for a conference of the Heads of the Four Governments at Geneva beginning July 18, representatives of the three inviting governments were in communication with you concerning the availability for the Conference of the Palais des Nations and certain other services of the United Nations. I am happy to inform you on behalf of the French and the British, as well as my own Government, that Mr. Molotov desires to join with us in making, on behalf of the four Governments, the request for the use of the United Nations facilities at Geneva which were earlier discussed with you by representatives of the three Western Governments.

Representatives of all four Governments in New York will be in touch with you in order to work out the details of the necessary arrangements. May I add in closing our appreciation for your cooperation in this matter.
