As you already may have heard, a big block of iron ore from our mines at Grängesberg will be shipped by the the above vessel at Oxelösund one of the next days, and consigned to you to be forwarded to Sparrows Point in due course. As the vessel will make an intermediate voyage on this side, we expect she will arrive at Sparrows Point only about Christmas.

We ask you kindly to arrange, at our expense, for the discharge of the ore block, and its forwarding to the United Nations Building in New York, under advice to Mr. Per Lind who is Mr. Hammarskjöld's personal secretary.

This piece of iron ore with its wooden casing has the following dimensions:

1.8 x 1.2 x 0.8 meters.

The space between the block and the casing is filled up with sand and the boards are secured by steel band.

The gross weight is 6 tons.

The case is marked "F.N."

For your further guidance the ore block will be placed in the tween-deck in the small hatch in the forward part of the vessel from where it probably can be unloaded by the vessel's own winches. Please discuss this matter with the Captain and take the necessary measures for safe discharge.

It is, as you will understand, very important that the block is handled carefully, both in discharging and on the transport to New York, so as not to damage the surface or cause breakage.


