Your Excellency,

On the occasion of the 2nd anniversary of the founding of the National Chapter of the Free Pacific Association, Republic of China, we sponsors and members of the Chapter wish to convey to Your Excellency, through this brief message, our most heartfelt admiration for the courageous job Your Excellency has done, to champion the cause of world peace and international justice, over the past years of grave world crises.

It is nearly half a century, since the late President Theodore Roosevelt predicted that the Twentieth Century would be " the Era of the Pacific ". The course of history, in the years that followed, has fully testified to the truthfulness of this prophecy. Today, in the face of the grim minacity of Communist aggression, all freedom-loving nations in this vital part of the world are linked together by a common lot, on the pivot of which turns the future destiny of mankind. It is a truism to say that, by this day, the Pacific region has become a most dynamic center of world developments.

It fills our hearts with sentiments of deep regret to recall that, during the past ten and more years, years as nightmarish as they were eventful, the aggressive force of International Communism, which took its opportune rise immediately after World War II, has by subversive activities or armed aggression shut the territories of many countries in this area behind the Iron Curtain, thereby placing hundreds of millions of people under its thralldom. Particularly, we feel engulfed by bitter thoughts to reflect that, with the tragic fall of the China mainland in 1949, this evil force has achieved rapid expansion in the Pacific theatre.

It is a fact we must face squarely that, within the span of the past one decade, the very existence of International Communism has constituted an increasingly grave menace ---whether it be direct or indirect--- to the whole of the West Pacific area. Under the pinch of our bitter experience in the past, we have come to the sober-minded conclusion that, unless this evil-savored force is checked in time, it is bound to work the worst conceivable havoc with all humanity, a havoc that will spell the doom of all spiritual values and cultural heritage of mankind, that will trample down all the worthy, free institutions dear to the civilized world.


