The Permanent Representative of Iran to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to acknowledge the receipt of his Note of 6 September 1960 advising of the flight over Iranian territory of 22 USA aircraft of the C-130 and C-124 type engaged in transporting a complete Indian military hospital and supply platoon together with 200,000 tons of equipment to Leopoldville which will take place between September 6 and 15.

The Permanent Representative of Iran wishes to inform the Secretary-General that the information contained in the above-mentioned Note was cabled to Teheran and the list of flights immediately sent to the Government of Iran.

The Permanent Representative of Iran presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to acknowledge the receipt of his Note of 15 August 1960 requesting general authorization by the Government of Iran for the flights over its territory to and from Leopoldville of three to five U.S. airplanes of the types C-124 or C-130 transporting, under the Security Council resolution of 14 July 1960, an Indian logistic group totalling 91 persons with their necessary equipment between New Delhi and the Congo.

The Permanent Representative of Iran wishes to confirm his telephone conversation of 17 August 1960 with Mr. Leo Malania of the Secretary-General's Office to the effect that the Secretary-General's message was immediately conveyed to the Government of Iran and that the Iranian Government has granted permission for the flights of the above-mentioned airplanes over its territory and the proper authorities in Iran have been duly notified.

The Chargé d'Affaires, a.i. wishes to confirm his telephone conversation of today with Mr. Andrew W. Cordier, Executive Assistant to the Secretary-General, and to inform the Secretary-General that, as to a communication received from his Government, Iran has no technicians available with experience regarding water installations. However, the Iranian Government is glad to make available, within its possibilities, technicians with experience in oil and railways.

It would be appreciated if the Secretary-General would advise the Chargé d'Affaires, a.i. of the number of technicians required in each of the two fields, as well as the date and duration their services will be needed. It would also be appreciated if the Secretary-General would inform the Chargé d'Affaires, a.i. as to what arrangements are being made for the transportation of these technicians and their daily allowances.
