VISIT TO AUSTRALIA OF
HIS EXCELLENCY MR. DAG HAMMARSKJOLD,
SECRETARY-GENERAL OF THE UNITED NATIONS.

(Mr. Hammarskjold will be accompanied by Mr. George Ivan Smith, Director of the United Nations Information Centre, London, Mr. Hugh Williams, Director of the United Nations Information Centre in Sydney, and Mr. William Ranallo, Personal Aide).

Monday February 13 7 a.m.

Mr. Hammarskjold, Mr. Smith and Mr. Ranallo arrive at Sydney airport by Qantas flight E.M.514, where they will be met by the Honourable J.O. Cramer, M.P., Minister for the Army, on behalf of the Australian Government, Mr. Hugh Williams, Mr. Patrick Shaw (Assistant Secretary, Department of External Affairs) and Mr. Francis Stuart, (Chief of Protocol). The party will be taken to the V.I.P. Room at the International Terminal where refreshments will be served.

10.15 a.m.

Mr. Hammarskjold and his party of three, accompanied by Mr. Shaw and Mr. Stuart, will leave for Canberra by T.A.A. flight No. 408.

11.10 a.m.

On arrival at Canberra Mr. Hammarskjold will be met by Lt. Colonel R.A. St. G. Martin, M.B.E., Military Secretary, and, with Mr. Ranallo and accompanied by Mr. Stuart, will leave for Government House where the Secretary-General will be the guest of Their Excellencies the Governor-General and Lady Slim for the duration of his Canberra stay.

Mr. Smith and Mr. Williams will leave in a Commonwealth Government car for the Hotel Canberra.

Mr. Hammarskjold will lunch with Their Excellencies.

3.30 p.m.

The Australian Mission to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to convey the following tentative programme which has been worked out by the Australian Government for the Secretary-General's forthcoming visit to Australia.

- February 13 Secretary-General to be met in Sydney by Chief of Protocol and accompanied to Canberra during morning. Talks during afternoon. Dinner by H.E. the Swedish Minister.
- February 14 Secretary-General to meet Australian Cabinet Ministers and lunch with them. Afternoon - free for further discussions. Evening - Dinner by H.E. the Governor-General of Australia.
- February 15 Secretary-General to visit Snowy River Scheme. Return to Canberra noon of 16th.
- February 16 Afternoon - Secretary-General to return to Sydney and spend evening at Hotel Australia before boarding aircraft to New Zealand.

It may be of assistance to the Secretary-General to know that the Australian Government proposes to treat the Secretary-General's visit as being primarily for discussion with the Prime Minister of Australia, other Cabinet Ministers and Government Officials, detailed arrangements for which can only be worked out later. So far as the Australian Government is concerned it is not proposed to include any public speaking engagements in the Secretary-General's programme. As indicated in the tentative programme, a visit by the Secretary-General to the Snowy River Scheme is considered feasible.

The Australian Mission will advise the Secretary-General's office of the details of any further entertainments which may be offered to the Secretary-General during his visit as soon as details are received.

Secretary-General's trip

I confirm my telegramme of 5 January reading as follows:

"SECGEN AND RANALLO ARRIVING CAMBERRA EX DJAKARTA TWELVE FORTYFIVE PM MONDAY FEBRUARY THIRTEENTH LEAVING FOR WELLINGTON FRIDAY FEBRUARY SEVENTEENTH THENCE FOR NEWYORK 8.05 AM MONDAY FEBRUARY TWENTIETH PLEASE MEET IN CANBERRA AND ACCOMPANY THROUGH WELLINGTON MAKE NO COMMITMENTS PUBLIC FUNCTIONS LETTER FOLLOWS."

..... I now attach, for your information, copy of the full itinerary of the Secretary-General's journey. So far as I know it is anticipated that the Secretary-General will be the official guest of the Government in each country, but arrangements are still in process. It will therefore be for the Foreign Office to make any arrangements for him and you should take no engagements and make no commitments on his behalf. On arrival the Secretary-General will, of course, talk with any correspondents, etc. who may come to the airport.

I am delighted that at last a United Nations visitor is coming to your region and that that visitor will be the Secretary-General. I sincerely hope that his presence will do a great deal to break down the feeling of distance and isolation which the people of your region must have towards the United Nations.

I need not, of course, give you special instructions as to what to do; you will be the Secretary-General's adviser and guardian so far as public information questions arise. If he is the official guest of the governments concerned they will, of course, handle most of his problems on his behalf, but you will be available as and when he wants you.

If you want further instructions you are welcome to ask for them and if new facts come to my knowledge of which you should be informed I will communicate with you again.
