President of the Senate since 1953.

Born 1900 and educated at Scone, New South Wales. Interested in local government affairs and Chairman of Scott Memorial Hospital, Scone, 1934-40. Senator for New South Wales since 1951.

MRS. McMULLIN

Senator and Mrs. McMullin have one daughter.

HIS EXCELLENCY MR. J. N. KASTENGREN

Minister of Sweden since 23.10.51.

Bachelor of Law, Bachelor of Economics. Attache at the Department of Foreign Affairs, Stockholm, 1917; New York 1918 and Stockholm 1921. Vice Consul 1921, Copenhagen 1922, Mariehamn 1923. First Secretary of Legation in Bern and Vienna 1923, Stockholm 1924. Chief of Section at the Department of Foreign Affairs, Stockholm 1928. Consul General in Calcutta 1931, in New York 1935. Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in Lima, La Paz and Quito from 1945-51.

MADAME KASTENGREN

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE R.G. CASEY, C.H., D.S.O., M.C., M.P.

Has been Minister of External Affairs since April 1951.

Liberal. Elected to House of Representatives for Corio, Victoria, 1931, 1934, 1937. Resigned in 1940 to become Australian Minister in U.S.A. Has been Minister for Supply and Development, Minister for Works and Housing, Minister in Charge of the Snowy Mountains Project.

Minister of State in the Middle East.

Member of War Cabinet in England 1942-43.

Governor of Bengal 1944-46.

President of Federal Liberal Party 1947-49.

MRS. CASEY

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE DR. H.V. EVATT, Q.C., M.P.

Leader of the Opposition in the present Parliament and  
Leader of the Parliamentary Labour Party since 1951.

Born in New South Wales in 1894 and educated at Sydney  
University.

Admitted to New South Wales Bar in 1917.

Was a member of the New South Wales Legislative Assembly  
1925-1929.

Justice of the High Court of Australia, 1930-1940; resigned  
to enter Federal Parliament 1941-1949 Attorney-General and  
Minister for External Affairs.

1941-1946 Member, Australian War Cabinet.

1942-1943 Australian representative in U.K. War Cabinet and  
leader of Australian wartime missions to Washington, London  
and New Zealand. Initiated establishment of and became  
Australian Member of Pacific War Council.

1945 Australian delegate to U.N. Conference, San Francisco.

1946-1949 Deputy Prime Minister of Australia.

1947 Chairman U.N. Palestine Commission and Australian  
representative on U.N. Security Council.

1948 President U.N. Assembly.

MRS. EVATTMR. A. H. TANGE, C.B.E.

Secretary, Department of External Affairs.

Born in 1914 and educated at the University of Western  
Australia, graduating in Arts. He served with the Bank  
of New South Wales from 1931 to 1941, and in 1942 joined  
the Department of Labour and National Service (Post-War  
Reconstruction Section).

In 1946 he joined the Department of External Affairs and  
from 1946 to 1948 was First Secretary, United Nations  
Mission, New York. From 1948 Mr. Tange has held the  
following appointments:-

1948-1951	Acting-Counsellor, United Nations Division.
1951-1953	Assistant Secretary, United Nations Division.
1953	Australian Minister in Washington.

He has attended several United Nations Conferences in  
Europe and the United States.

 Director, Social Service Department, Methodist Church  
 of Australia, since 1948.  
 Born 1905 and educated at Glen Innes High School and

 1932-36 with the Inland Mission, Mt. Isa.  
 1941-42 Mayor of Junee whilst resident Minister.  
 Held various posts with United Nations, Australia,  
 since 1952. At present Vice-Chairman of N.S.W. Child  
 Welfare Advisory Council.  
 Has published two books, "Our Task" 1938, and "Christ  
 and Society" 1952.
