Dear Mr Cordier,

I set out the itinerary for the Secretary-General's visit to New Zealand as received here by telegram from the Department of External Affairs:-

Friday, 17 February.

Record 13½ minute broadcast for transmission over all National Stations on evening of Sunday, 19 February. The National Broadcasting Service has suggested that, taking the admission of sixteen new members as a starting point, Mr Hammarskjold might like to look forward to the next ten years in the United Nations.

Call on Mayor of Auckland. It is assumed that this call will be followed by a small civic gathering.

After lunch motor to Rotorua (Grand Hotel). As mentioned in earlier correspondence, this is in the thermal regions and also one of the principal Maori centres. The stopover at Rotorua, rather than at Waitomo which we discussed earlier, has been recommended on the ground that the travelling time is comparable, the roads are better and the scenery much more interesting.

Saturday, 18 February.

Motor to Chateau Tongariro in Tongariro National Park.

Sunday, 19 February.

Motor to Wellington - probably Hotel Waterloo. An informal gathering will be arranged for this evening.

Monday, 20 February.

Call on Secretary of External Affairs and meet other officers of Department of External Affairs.

- 1 p.m. State Lunch at Hotel Waterloo. Secretary-General will be invited to respond to the Prime Minister's welcome and on the basis of normal practice a speech of about twenty to thirty minutes would be appropriate.
- 3 p.m. Meet Executive Council of New Zealand United Nations Association (probably at Hotel Waterloo).
- 4.30 p.m. Formal call on Mayor of Wellington.
- 5 p.m. Attend cocktail party to be given in Mr Hammarskjold's honour by the Minister of External Affairs.
- 8 p.m. Dinner at Swedish Legation.

Tuesday, 21 February.

Return by air to Auckland to connect with plane for Nandi, Fiji, at 1.15 p.m.

I shall let you have further details of the programme as soon as they are received. The Department of External Affairs has been requested to send a copy of the itinerary to Mr Hugh Williams in Sydney.

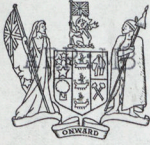


