In the course of the current contacts with the Governments party to the General Armistice Agreements, the Secretary-General has submitted to the Governments of Egypt and Israel certain proposals by the Chief of Staff, Major-General Burns. By these proposals the Secretary-General and the Chief of Staff wish to strengthen the observer organization in the Gaza area, for the purpose of supporting compliance with the Armistice Agreement, especially the unconditional cease fire with reserve for self-defence in accordance with the United Nations Charter, and the orders issued for its enforcement of which the Secretary-General has been notified.

Agreement with the two sides on the proposals of General Burns has now been reached, for formal adoption in the Mixed Armistice Commission. The proposals provide for the establishment, on each side of the Demarcation Line along the Gaza area, of a number of fixed United Nations Observation Posts, to be supplemented by mobile United Nations patrols when necessary.
