Dear Dr. Nincic,

This is to confirm my telephone conversation with you regarding the Secretary-General's visit to your country.

As indicated he will arrive from Vienna at 3.45 pm on Tuesday, 10 July via Yugoslav Airlines, Flight 243 and will depart for Geneva on Thursday, 12 July on Swissair Flight 247 which is now scheduled to leave at 9.00 am. We are hoping to get some delay on this flight, but have not yet received a reply.

The Secretary-General will be accompanied by Dr. Dragoslav Protitch, Under-Secretary for Political and Security Council Affairs, and Mr. Lennart Finmark and Mr. William Ranallo, respectively Personal Assistant and Personal Aide to the Secretary-General.

The Secretary-General would appreciate your early advice as to the program that your Government may be able to arrange for the visit.
