Dear Mr. Birecki,

This is to confirm my telephone conversation with you with regard to the Secretary-General's visit to Warsaw.

The Secretary-General will be delighted to have you accompany him on the same plane on Wednesday, 27 June from New York to Warsaw. I am making a reservation for you and the ticket will be transmitted shortly. The party will be leaving New York on Scandinavian Airlines Flight 912 at 4.00 pm 27 June, arriving Copenhagen 1.40 pm, 28 June. Departure will take place from Copenhagen on Polish Airlines Flight 238, 4.05 pm, arriving Warsaw at 6.35 pm. The Secretary-General and his party will depart from Warsaw on Saturday, 30 June for Stockholm via Polish Airlines flight 237 at 7.05 am.

Mr. Lennart Finmark (Sweden) and Mr. William Ranallo (USA), respectively Personal Assistant and Personal Aide to the Secretary-General, will be members of the Secretary-General's party in Warsaw.

On the Secretary-General's extensive trip to Member countries in January and February of this year, he found that the local program worked out most satisfactorily both from the point of view of the host government and the Secretary-General when the program was established in advance. He would hope therefore that you would take up the matter of establishing the program with your Government at your earliest convenience, so that he and you could talk it over in advance of your departure.
