MRS. PANDIT, PRESIDENT OF U.N. GENERAL ASSEMBLY

UN 41319 - UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., 15 Sept. 1953 -

The eighth session of the United Nations General Assembly, which convened this afternoon at U.N. Headquarters, elected Mrs. Vijaya Lakshmi Pandit, of India, as its President. The balloting was secret; Mrs. Pandit received 37 votes, seven more than the required majority for election; Prince Wan Waithayakon, of Thailand, the only other candidate received 22 votes.

This year, she said, the Assembly had particularly great opportunities, since the new session was opening in an international atmosphere that gave hope for a beginning towards real easing of world tensions.
