NINTH ANNUAL HIGHER EDUCATION CONFERENCE OPENS AT U.N. HEADQUARTERS

The Ninth Annual Higher Education Conference held its opening session at United Nations Headquarters tonight. The conference is sponsored by the New York University School of Education, the United Nations and the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, and is being attended by some 300 Presidents and Deans of colleges and universities. The central theme of the two-day conference is "The Educational Responsibilities of Higher Education" with respect to education for international understanding, the United Nations, the personnel problems of technical assistance, and the research opportunities of the United Nations.

U.N. STAFF DONATES \$5,000 FOR GREEK EARTHQUAKE RELIEF

A check in the amount of \$5,000, representing an advance contribution from a U.N. Secretariat Appeal for Greek Earthquake Relief, was turned over this afternoon by Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjöld to Ambassador Alexis Kyrrou, Permanent Representative of Greece to the U.N.; who said he was accepting the check with "deep emotion" and he was sure that his feeling would be shared by the stricken peoples of the Ionian islands, who would greatly appreciate this gift for their relief.
