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

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
These »**Special Circular Tours**» are arranged in purpose to show independent travellers and parties the curiosities of Stockholm and its environs in a comfortable and practical manner.

 We beg to call readers attention to the numerous refreshing excursions by steamboats into the beautiful surroundings of Stockholm.

Five days Programme, specially arranged by

Operahuset . Stockholm



First Day.

First Carriage Drive. The carriages leave the Operahuset (outside Stockholms Resebureau) every Monday at 9 a. m. and proceed via Kungsträdgården, Molins fountain, Monument of Charles XII:s & Charles XIII, Norrmalmstorg, Birger Jarlsgatan, Humlegården, Monument of Linnée and Schéele, Sturegatan, Idrottsparken (Sport Grounds — half an hour inside), Karlavägen, Circus, Narvavägen, Oscars-church (outside), Biological Museum (20 minutes inside), the park »Djurgården», Parkudden (summer residences of the royal Prince Charles. Outside), royal palace Rosendal (outside), Strandvägen avenue. — Lunch at 1 p. m. at »Operakällaren». At 3 p. m. excursion by steamer »Express» to Waxholm. Return at 5 p. m. and dinner at 6,30 at Grand Hotel.

Second Day.

Excursion to Drottningholm. The Members leave Stockholms Resebureau at 8,30 a. m. and walk over Norrbro to Riddarholmshamnen (hamnen=harbour). The Steamer »Tessin» leaves Riddarholmen at 9 a. m., runs along the beautiful shores of the Mälarlake and arrives on about 35 minutes later at Drottningholm. Drottningholms Palace, an impo-

sing white structure of very considerable dimensions, was built in the latter part of the seventeenth century by Queen Hedvig Eleonora. Its interior is very beautiful and costly, the wide and lofty vestibule, with its double staircaise, its sculptures and frescoes, being a masterpiece of Tessin the Younger. The surrounding park, of wonderful freshness, has a good fountain, and here and there, dotted about among the trees, are marble statues. From the Palace, proceeding to »China Chateau» (20 minutes inside), built in china style by King Gustavus III and containing many and rare chines-curiosities. Lunch at 11,30 a. m. at Drottningholms Restaurant. — »Tessin» returns to Stockholm at 1 p. m. and after arrival there the party will visit the Riddarholms Church. This church with its three crypts, is the mausoleum of the Royal Family, and here lie nearly all the sovereigns that have reigned in Sweden during the last three hundred years. Under hundreds of flags and banners, won in war, and the escutcheons of the Seraphim Order of Knights, lie here buried the great hero of the Thirty Years' War, King Gustavus Adolphus; the famous warriorlion of the North, Charles XII; besides many other kings, princes and statesmen with their consorts.

From the Riddarholms Church, the party proceeds to Slussen, walking along the Munkbron, Mälartorget & Kornhamnstorg. At 3,30 p. m. by steam ferry-boat to Djurgården and up to Skansen, belonging to

the Northern-Museum. Skansen, an open-air Museum is one of the most interesting Museums of the World.

Here we find a Lapplander's camp with winter and summer huts, reindeer park with its reinder, and Lappland dogs; peasant houses from several provinces, a summer house, where The Swedish seer Svedenborg had several of his revelations from the spiristworld. On the rise of ground above the peasanthouse from Blekinge, is the prospect-tower *Bredablick*, from whose top there is a most magnificent view of Stockholm and its environs. To the west of Skansen is *Hasselbacken*, summer-restaurant, with beautiful situation, large garden, daily military concert. Dinner there at 7.00 p. m.

Third Day.

Second Carriage Drive. The carriages leave the Operahuset (outside Stockholms Resebureau) at 8,30 a. m. and proceed via Wasagatan, Central Railway-station, New Central Post-office, Bibliothek of Nobel-Institut, Barnhusgatan, Folkets hus (the Peoples house, $\frac{1}{4}$ hour inside), Drottninggatan, Norrtullsgatan—Haga Park (chateau, outside) Norrtullsgatan, Drottninggatan, Northern-Museum (30 minuts inside), Kungsgatan, Kungsholmsgatan, Pilgatan—Handtverkaregatan, the Garnisons Hospital,

Royal Mint, Seraphimers Hospital, Fredsgatan. Gustavus Adolphus square (Gustaf Adolfs torg). Lunch at 11,30 at Restaurant Metropol and Café at Operaterassen. At 3,15 p. m. by steamer to Saltsjöbaden. Dinner at 6 p. m. at Saltsjöbadens restaurant. (The Steamer to Saltsjöbaden leaves Skeppsbron (en face the statue of Gustavus III). Salt-Sea-Baths (Saltsjöbaden) is probably the most frequented pleasure resort in the environs of Stockholm. It is splendidly situated on Baggensfjord a picturesque Bay, surrounded by pine-woods and commanding grand views of the Islands and the Baltic. Return by train to Stockholm in the evening. (Every hour a train.)

Fourth Day.

Excursion by rail to Upsala and back to Stockholm same day. The train leaves Stockholm at 9,45 a. m. from Central Station and arrives at Upsala at 11,10 a. m. Upsala is the most famous universitytown in Sweden and the residence of the Archbishop. The kathedral (1289—1435) is picturesquely situated and contains the Burial Chapel of Gustavus Vasa. The University was founded in 1477. The Carolina Rediviva contains the valuable library of the University, 200,000 volumes and 7,000 manuscripts, the chief treasure being the famous Codex Argenteus, a trans-

lation of the four Gospels, dating from about the end of the 4:ther century. A carriage drive will be taken to »Old Upsala». Luncheon at Upsala. Return to Stockholm by rail at 5,30 f. m. Dinner at 7,15 at Hotel Rydberg.

Fifth Day.

At 9 a. m. by tramway to the St. Caterine Lift Ascension. Walking through the Vesterlånggatan, in the old city, to the Royal Palace (c:a 1 hour inside.) By steam-ferry boat to Natioalmuseum 1¹/₂ h. inside. At 12,30 p. m. Lunch at »Blås Ut», a garden restaurant at Kastell-holmen, idyllicly situated at sea. After Lunch, visiting the Royal Robe Chamber (Kongl. klädkammaren) and the Armoury (Lifrustkammaren) containing a fine collection of armour and historic relics, and a very interesting and rich collection af royal garments, coronation robes etc. (1 heure inside). At about 3 p. m. by steamer to Lidingöbro värdshus, picturesquely situated at the Värta fjord. A five o'clock tea is offered at Lidingebro. Return by steamer to Stockholm and after arrival there Dinner at Grand Hotel.

Fares for this tuor of 5 Days. Pd. st. 4/11/7.

What is included.

1. Two meals per day consisting of Luncheon and Dinner.
2. Customary Fees to restaurant railway and Steam boat servants.

3. Two Carriage drives according to the itinerary.
4. Excursion-fares according to the itinerary.
5. Fees for sightseeing according to the programme.
6. The services of a competent Conductor, who will accompany the parties and undertake the general supervision of the arrangements throughout.

Drinks not included.

Every Tuesday, Thursday and Friday at 9 a. m. Carriages leave the Grand Hotel and proceed via Kungsträdgården, Monument of Char-

les XII and Charles XIII, Molins fountain, Norrmalmstorg, Birger Jarlgatan, Humlegården, Monument of Linné and Schéele, Sturegatan, Idrottsparken (Athletic-Grounds half an hour inside), Karlavägen, Circus »Olympia», Narvavägen, Oscars-church (outside), Biological Museum (20 minutes inside). the Park »Djurgården», Parkudden (summerresidence of the royal Prince Charles, outside), the Royal Palace Rosendal (outside) Strandvägen avenue, Arsenalsgatan, Royal Opera, Fredsgatan, Vasagatan Central Railway Station, New-Central Post-Office, Bibliothek of the Nobel Institut, Folkets hus (the peopels house 15 min inside) Barnhusgatan. Drottninggatan, Northern Museum (35 min. inside), Drottninggatan, Fredsgatan, Monument of Gustavus Adolphus. Lunch at 1 at Grand Hôtel.

Fare including drive, fees for sightseeing, a conducters services and Lunch **Pd st. 0/12/0** each drive.
